## Antioch Little League Celebrates Completion of its Renovation with Grand Re-Opening and Ribbon Cutting Ceremony, Saturday, April 2

Local Non-Profit Organization, "TLC for Kids Sports" Grants Local Youth A New Ball Field and Congressional Recognition

BERKELEY, CA, March 22, 2011 – Non-profit organization TLC for Kids Sports, sponsored by O.C. Jones & Sons, Inc., announced today that the Grand Re-Opening and Ribbon Cutting Ceremony for Antioch Little League fields will take place on Saturday, April 2, at 10 a.m. The fields are located at 10<sup>th</sup> and O Streets in Antioch, California. The event is the culmination of hard work, dedication and a little TLC that was much-needed by the local community. Antioch Little League has been active in the area for over 50 years and includes boys divisions from T-ball through Majors, girls softball divisions, and The Challenger Division; a very special program designed for physically and mentally disabled children, ages 5–22 years old, to enjoy tee ball or coach pitched baseball.

In true baseball fashion, the ceremony will begin at 10 a.m. with the national anthem. Brian Hooker, from the office of Congressman John Garamendi, will be in attendance to present a Certificate of Congressional Recognition for the event, followed by a Challenger Invitational Game in which celebrity athletes including Brent Jones, former San Francisco 49er, and Vicky Galindo, Olympic Silver Medalist – Softball will participate. Other invited guests include notable public officials, community representatives and local athletes.

O.C. Jones & Sons, Inc., a Berkeley-based construction firm, created TLC for Kids Sports, a non-profit community outreach effort aimed at improving kids' sports fields. Through an ongoing partnership with KNBR 680/1050 AM Radio, a contest was created for local youth sports fields to be selected and fully renovated in hopes to create a positive long lasting impact on local youth.

"Sponsoring the TLC for Kids Sports program has been a way for all of us at O.C. Jones to give back and our employees recognize there is always a way to give back," said Kelly Kolander, President and CEO of O.C. Jones & Sons, Inc. Work is almost complete in transforming the rundown fields into a place of great pride where the Challenger program can flourish. Throughout the renovation, O.C. Jones & Sons, Inc. gave priority attention to access, safety and community space. Children will be playing on a safer infield, reducing the potential for injury. Paved areas for community gatherings with picnic tables have also been installed as well as new and improved handicapped accessible areas for Challenger children. Facelifts to the dugouts, fences, bleachers and backstops were also made.

"O.C. Jones and TLC for Kids Sports has just given our community the best gift our kids, parents and families could ask for...hope, pride and joy!" said Fred Shier, Field Site Manager/Board Member of the Antioch Little League in reaction to winning the contest for the field renovation.
